UCL Application Guidance

Postgraduate Diploma in Children and Young Person IAPT Therapy

Please note that you will need to submit an application form to University College London for aplace on the course in addition to the job application that you make to the relevant Service.

We strongly recommend you read the <u>FAQs</u> for more in-depth information about both the course and applications, which will help you understand the process and whether you would be eligible.

Entrance Criteria

Applications to the programme will be reviewed against the following criteria:

- A minimum of a second-class Bachelor's degree from a UK university or an overseas qualification of an equivalent standard in a relevant subject (e.g. psychology).
 - o Applicants who do not fulfil the academic criteria but have relevant professional experience are encouraged to apply and will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
- Motivation to undertake and complete the course.
- **Professional Registration** (such as nursing, social worker, occupational therapist etc.). This is highly desirable for all modalities, and mandatory for some. Please read the <u>FAQ</u> for more information.
- Candidates must apply to both the course and job at the same time to ensure a smooth recruitment process.
- Experience of working therapeutically with children/young people in a mental health setting.
- If your education has not been conducted in the English language, you will be expected to demonstrate evidence of an adequate level of English proficiency. 
Please note that applications will not be considered from applicants who are formally registered (or re-sitting examinations) for another programme of study at UCL or any other Higher Education Institution.





As part of your online application, we would like you to write a personal statement of up to 1000 words.

Please include:

- Your name
- o The modalities and why you are interested in them
- Why you would like to do this course?
 - o Personal motivation
 - o Career relevance
- Describe any relevant experience you have in the field.
- How would you cope with the academic demands of the course while balancing your work and life?

Interviews

Upon submission of your two applications (job & university), your applications will be considered by the teams, and you will be informed of whether you have secured a job interview with the service. The interview will consist of questions from the service as well as some supplied from the University. The final decision on your application will be made in collaboration between the employer and the university. The employer will provide successful candidates a conditional offer dependent on the final university checks.

Please note that the course team will be unable to reject an application until closer to the start date of the course. However, you may receive emails from the wider University admissions team chasing up documents in the meantime. We apologise for an inconvenient this causes but to ensure that the teams can recruit we are unable to reject candidates until recruitment has completed for all services.
