Purpose of the post

- To respond to any reasonable request made by the Headteacher.

Accountability for leading, managing and developing pupils within a specific classroom

Working with all staff across the school:

- Work under the direction of the school to ensure the needs of all children are met through teaching effective sessions.
- Plan, prepare and monitor progress in lessons in accordance with the agreed school curriculum policies, schemes of work and in partnership with other staff.
- Within the classroom maintain appropriate resources for the use of children.
- Teach across the curriculum maintaining high standards at all times.
- Work closely with a colleague and all staff across the school to ensure that the needs of children are effectively met.
- Develop support and links within the wider community.
- Work within and maintain the school ethos.

Working across the whole school

Working with staff across the school:

- Develop personal expertise and share this with other teachers.
- Contribute to the welfare of all pupils, throughout the school, by setting a
 personal example of the ethos of the school, working as part of the school
 team and supporting colleagues.
- Act as a role model of good classroom practice modelling effective strategies.
- Work effectively alongside a job share partner and under the line management of the team leader.
- Contribute towards all aspects of school life.

Teacher's Standards

At all times the Teacher's Standards will be maintained;

Part One: Teaching

- 1. Set high expectations which inspire, motivate and challenge pupils.
- 2. Promote good progress and outcomes by pupils.
- 3. Demonstrate good subject and curriculum knowledge.
- 4. Plan and teach well-structured lessons.
- 5. Adapt teaching to respond to the strengths and needs of all pupils.
- 6. Make accurate and productive use of assessment.
- 7. Manage behaviour effectively to ensure a good and safe learning.

Fuller and wider responsibilities will also be maintained;

- Making a positive contribution to the wider life and ethos of the school.
- Developing effective professional relationships with colleagues, knowing how and when to draw on advice and specialist support
- Deploying support staff effectively.
- Taking responsibility for improving teaching through appropriate professional development, responding to advice and feedback from colleagues
- Communicating effectively with parents with regard to pupils' achievements and well-being.
